

Woodland Community Audit of Flock + Additional Flock Concerns/Notes

February 17, 2026

Audit report of Woodland PD Flock Data from 01/01/26 to 2/02/26

Data Obtained via Public Request

A search is when a law enforcement officer types a license plate number or vehicle characteristics into the Flock system to pull up every time and place that vehicle was captured by any camera on the network — in this case, Woodland's cameras.

Data Highlights

- Total searches in January 2026 within Woodland PD cameras: **507,765**
- Searches conducted by the Woodland PD: **424**
- Total CA Organizations that accessed Woodland Flock cameras: **315** of the 318 that have access
 - Full listing of Organizations with access found in the final pages of this document

- Woodland PD conducts **1 search for every 1,197** done by a CA shared Organization
- **Woodland PD accounts for ~0.1%** searches for January 2026

Notable Searches by Organizations (excluding Woodland PD)

Findings were listed under “reason” for conducting the search

- Roseville PD searched Woodland PD data for camera data for the full week of 1/17/2026 to 1/24/2026, without any crime listed as the reason. **The search term was "Other - PROTESTS"**. At this time, protests were happening nationwide in response to the killings of Renee Good. The search was done the day the news of Alex Pretti's murder broke.

Searches on Woodland PD data potentially done by other CA organizations on behalf of Federal Agencies:

- **San Bernardino County CA SO had 37 searches for "Other - DOJ request" and many of them accessed more than a year of Flock data from Woodland PD.** (This is separate from the search term "Other- DOJ stop" which was also used.)
- Corona CA PD: one search "Other - National Security"
- Los Angeles CA PD ran 112 searches with "atf inv" or "ATF task force inv firearm trafficking suspect" as the reason
- San Diego County CA SD gave the reason "Robbery - **USPS Inspector req flock results for 211 PC case.**"
- Riverside County CA SO 9 searches "Drugs/Narcotics - dea case"
- San Diego County CA SD 6 searches "Drugs/Narcotics - dea investigation"

EFF.org (Electronic Frontier Foundation) had reported that some CA police departments had been using **racist search terms as part of their "reason" for search.** This was also the case for organizations searching Woodland PD data during the audited time period.

- Roseville CA PD, Glendale CA PD, and Westminster CA PD each ran searches on Woodland data that included the slur "gypsy."

Northern California Regional Intelligence Center (NCRIC) – 13,208 searches

The Northern California Regional Intelligence Center (NCRIC) is a **state-designated and federally recognized information sharing** and analysis hub. **Operating as one of the national network** of "Fusion Centers," the NCRIC was established following the post-9/11 push for enhanced domestic security coordination. The NCRIC's primary function is integrating threat-related information from various law enforcement, public safety, and homeland security sources. This process supports decision-making and operational planning across the region, as the center acts as a **two-way flow of information between federal agencies and state and local partners.** per [legalclarity.org/](https://www.legalclarity.org/)

Beyond Woodland PD Flock Data Audit

Mountain View, California (January 30, 2026)

What Happened: Mountain View discovered federal agencies had been accessing their Flock data for months without the city's knowledge or permission. Flock had enabled "nationwide search" settings, allowing agencies across the country to search Mountain View's license plate data.

Agencies that accessed data:

- ATF (Kentucky)
- ATF (Tennessee)
- Langley Air Force Base (Virginia)
- GSA Office of Inspector General

Timeline:

- **August – November 2024:** "Nationwide search" enabled (3 months)
- **August 2024 – January 5, 2026:** "Statewide lookup" enabled without authorization (17 months)
- **250+ California agencies** conducted 600,000 unauthorized searches

Police Chief's Response:

Mountain View Police Chief Mike Canfield announced the immediate suspension of all Flock cameras, stating in an official letter to the community:

"While the Flock Safety pilot program demonstrated clear value in enhancing our ability to protect our community and help us solve crimes, **I personally no longer have confidence in this particular vendor.**"

"Like many of you, I was deeply disappointed to learn that Flock Safety did not meet the City's requirements regarding our data access control and transparency. The existence of access by out-of-state agencies, without the City's awareness, that circumvented the protections we purposefully built and believed were in place is **frankly unacceptable to me** and to the dedicated people of the MVPD."

Current Status: All cameras suspended. City Council is reviewing whether to cancel the contract permanently.

Lack of Basic Security

Published Dec 22, 2025, researcher Benn Jordan discovered 60+ Flock Condor cameras streaming live to the internet with no password required. Jordan also identified the lack of mandatory multi-factor authentication to be high concern.

What Was Exposed:

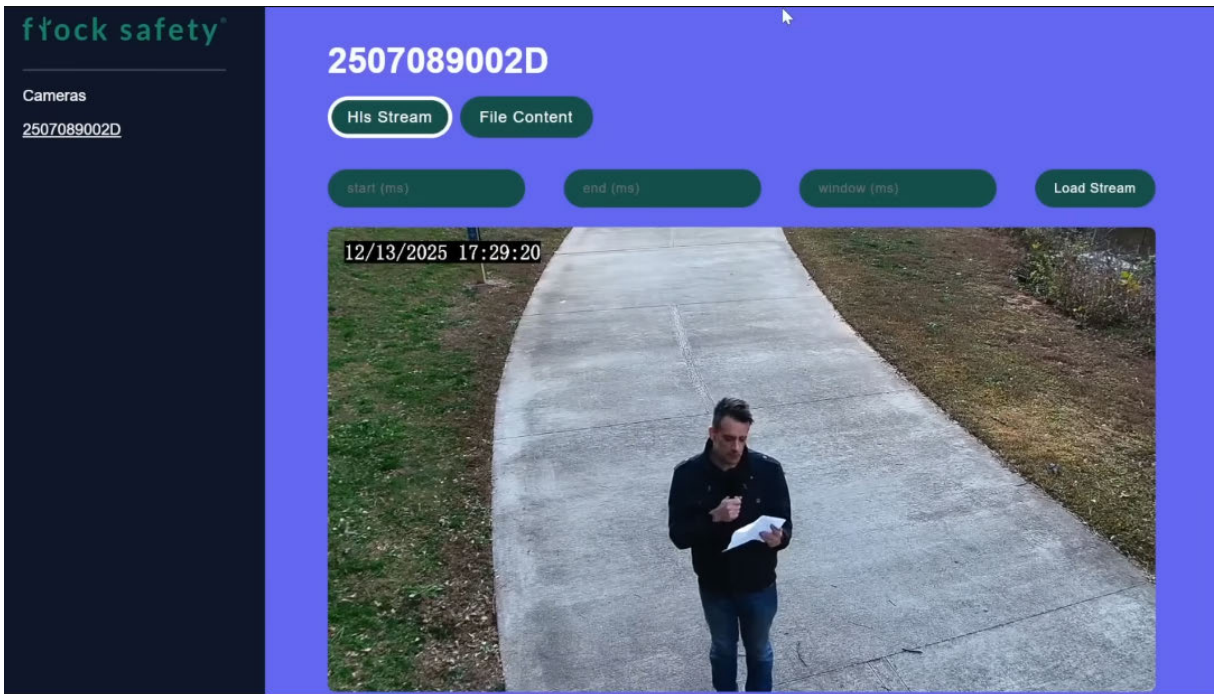
- Live video feeds from across the country
- 30 days of archived video available for download
- Administrative control panels (could change settings, delete footage)
- **No encryption** on any data
- Footage included children playing on playground swings

How It Was Discovered: Simple search on Shodan (IoT search engine): “HTTP title Flock Admin”

Flock’s Response: Called it “limited misconfiguration on very small number of devices”

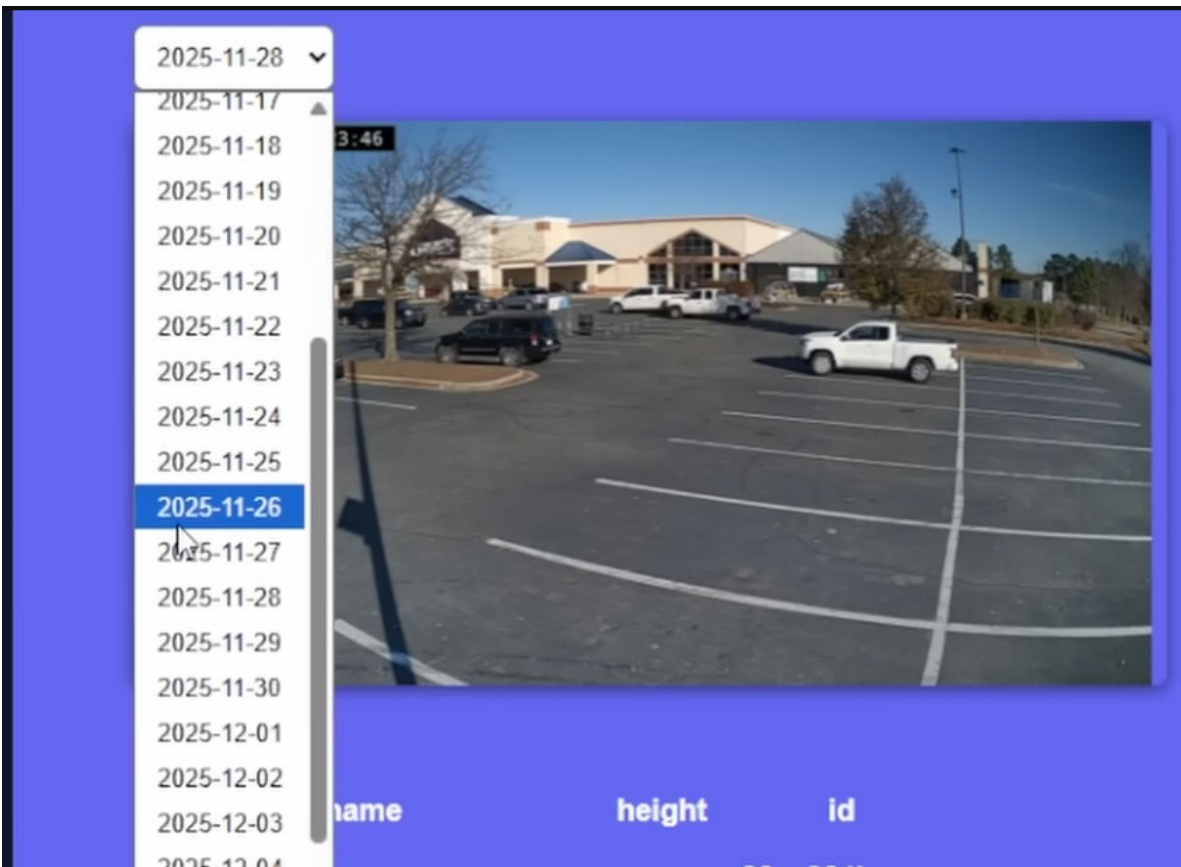

Notable Cities Canceling, Suspending, Pausing, Investigating Flock Contracts California:

- **Los Altos Hills** – Severed ties completely
- **Mountain View** – Suspended all cameras (decision pending Feb 24, 2026)
- **Oakland** – Rejected \$2 million expansion
- **Richmond** – Shutdown their system
- **Santa Cruz** – Terminated contract

Other States:

- **Staunton, VA** – Canceled after CEO's email
- **Woodburn, OR** – 60-day suspension
- **Olympia, WA** – Canceled contract
- **Mountlake Terrace, WA** – Reviewing contract
- **Skamania County, WA** – Considering cancellation

Community Message from Police Chief Mike Canfield Regarding Flock Safety Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) Pilot Program

To the Mountain View Community,

I am sharing with you an important decision I have made regarding the City of Mountain View's Flock Safety automated license plate reader (ALPR) pilot program and the values guiding my decision. I also want to thank you for the feedback we've received from concerned residents about the City's pilot program. **Effective immediately, all Flock Safety ALPR cameras in Mountain View will be turned off.** These cameras will remain inactive until our City Council provides further direction about the future of having Flock Safety ALPR cameras in our community. The City Council is anticipated to discuss this matter at its February 24 meeting.

I made this decision after careful consideration and deliberation. While the Flock Safety pilot program demonstrated clear value in enhancing our ability to protect our community and help us solve crimes, I personally no longer have confidence in this particular vendor. Like many of you, I was deeply disappointed to learn that Flock Safety did not meet the City's requirements regarding our data access control and transparency.

The existence of access by out of state agencies, without the City's awareness, that circumvented the protections we purposefully built and believed were in place is frankly unacceptable to me and to the dedicated people of the MVPD. Furthermore, this vendor's lack of proactive disclosure is inconsistent with the standards the MVPD holds and the assurances we were given by the Flock team. I, in turn, gave assurances to the community that I now know were not grounded in the Flock system's actual practice.

Community trust is more important than any individual tool. We know that the most vital asset in public safety is not technology; it is the relationship we have with you, the people we are here to serve and protect. I share your anger and frustration regarding how Flock Safety's system enabled out-of-state agencies to search our license plate data, and I am sorry that such searches occurred. I know how essential transparency is for maintaining trust and for community policing. This is why MVPD has been so open about what we learned and why we are pausing this program until our City Council can weigh in.

I am proud of the work of the MVPD and our dedication to our Mountain View community, and I value the support we receive from our residents. Our commitment remains unchanged: to protect this community from harm, to ensure Mountain View remains safe, and to uphold our shared value of being a "Community for All." Again, I personally want to apologize to our community and thank you for your continued engagement and support. We will keep you informed as this process moves forward, and we remain committed to listening to, learning from, protecting, and serving you.

Dear Chair Ferguson:

We write to request that the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) investigate Flock Safety (“Flock”), the license plate surveillance camera company, and, where appropriate, hold the company responsible for its negligent cybersecurity practices. Flock’s surveillance data can reveal Americans’ movements over time, including trips to doctors and therapists, support group meetings for alcohol or drug addiction, as well as places of worship and protests. By not requiring industry-standard multi-factor authentication (MFA) to secure law enforcement accounts, Flock has needlessly exposed Americans’ sensitive personal data captured by the company’s surveillance cameras to theft by hackers and foreign spies, and unauthorized access through multiple documented instances of unauthorized password sharing.

Flock operates the largest network of surveillance cameras in the United States, reportedly contracting with over 5,000 police departments, 1,000 businesses, and numerous homeowners associations across 49 states. When a vehicle passes by a Flock camera, Flock records plate information, vehicle characteristics, and when and where the vehicle was spotted. Flock’s network of surveillance cameras generate and store billions of vehicle scans each month. Flock reportedly enables law enforcement to search through this data not just by plate number, but also by make, model, and even bumper stickers.

In addition to being able to search data generated by cameras their agencies pay for, Flock’s law enforcement customers can also search data collected by other Flock customers’ cameras. Flock customers can allow access by specific law enforcement agencies and can also enroll into the “National Lookup Tool” which allows their data to be searched by all other enrolled Flock customers. Flock informed Congress this August that approximately 75% of Flock’s law enforcement customers have opted into the National Lookup Tool, which is likely due to Flock restricting access to nationwide searches to agencies that have agreed to share their data. But because most law enforcement agency customers have access to this tool, hackers, foreign spies, or anyone else that gains access to a Flock customer account can misuse it to track Americans across the country.

Flock has unnecessarily exposed Americans’ sensitive personal data to theft by hackers and foreign spies. While Flock offers support for MFA, a widely recognized cybersecurity best practice, Flock does not require it, which the company confirmed to Congress in October. Moreover, Flock continues to support insecure methods of MFA, such as sending a numeric code to a phone by text message, which is vulnerable to interception and phishing. Flock does not natively support phishing-resistant MFA, which the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency calls “the gold standard method of [MFA].” Phishing-resistant MFA is required of federal agencies and mandated by both the Federal Communications Commission and the FTC


Flock's failure to natively support and require phishing-resistant MFA means that if hackers or foreign spies steal, phish, or otherwise learn a law enforcement officer's Flock password, they can gain access to law-enforcement-only areas of Flock's website and search the billions of photos of Americans' license plates collected by taxpayer-funded cameras across the country. This threat is not theoretical. A search by Congressional staff of a public tool operated by the cybersecurity company Hudson Rock documenting accounts compromised by a form of malware known as an "infostealer" reveals that passwords for at least 35 Flock customer accounts have been stolen. Security researcher Benn Jordan also recently provided our offices with a screenshot from a Russian-language cybercrime forum in which Flock accounts appear to be offered for sale.

By not requiring MFA, Flock has also enabled unauthorized access through law enforcement officers sharing their Flock passwords. If Flock required MFA, law enforcement users of Flock would be required to approve each login to their account from a new computer. On August 11, 2025, Unraveled Press revealed that a Drug Enforcement Administration officer used the Flock account of a local police detective in Palos Heights, Illinois, to conduct several searches. Public records obtained by the press revealed that the detective confirmed that it was a common practice for members of a DEA task force that he was part of to use his login credentials to conduct Flock searches. That numerous federal agents were able to access Flock's systems using passwords belonging to other users without being detected or blocked raises serious questions about the effectiveness of Flock's cybersecurity defenses. A July 9, 2025, memo by the Palos Heights Deputy Chief of Police about the incident, which was released to the press, revealed that the department had not enabled the MFA option until after the password sharing was first identified by a reporter at 404 Media.


Flock's failure to require MFA is likely an unfair business practice prohibited by Section 5 of the FTC Act. In at least four cases — against Uber, Chegg, Drizly, and Blackbaud — the FTC held that failure to require MFA is an unfair business practice. Flock's negligent cybersecurity practices may also violate state laws related to data protection, consumer privacy or the use of automatic license plate reader (ALPR) systems; for example, California Civil Code § 1798.90.53 requires entities operating ALPR systems to "maintain reasonable security procedures and practices, including operational, administrative, technical, and physical safeguards, to protect ALPR information from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification, or disclosure."

Flock has received vast sums of taxpayer money to build a national surveillance network. But Flock's cavalier attitude towards cybersecurity needlessly exposes Americans to the threat of hackers and foreign spies tapping this data. Accordingly, we urge the FTC to hold Flock accountable for its negligent cybersecurity practices.
